## 8 New Business

### 8.1 Oxford Chamber of Commerce GetOfferz App Presentation

Dave Bryan reviewed how COVID-19 has affected the Chamber and Oxford businesses, including the loss of funds due to the cancelation of the Oxford Wine Festival. Bryan spoke about the GetOfferz<sup>1</sup> app, which allows citizens to get coupons to all types of local businesses by signing up for a \$1.99 monthly membership to the app. Bryan advised that the Chamber receives 30% of the fees collected by GetOfferz. Bryan reported that the Chamber would be marketing the app using signage, social media, and on the web. Businesses will be able to add coupons to the app within minutes. SCRC members asked questions about fees and alcohol sales. Bryan advised that additional features would be coming soon, including push notifications.

### 8.2 Health and Wellness Discussion

Douglas asked how commission members are feeling about Miami University's announcement of in-person graduation ceremonies. Commission members expressed appreciation that students will be able to celebrate.

McVey and Douglas asked for an update on the rollout of COVID-19 vaccines to students. Baudry Young advised that Miami University is still waiting for information from the Ohio Governor's Office, which is controlling distribution of the vaccine. Shirley and Marston spoke about their success in getting vaccines. Marston advised people to subscribe to Butler County Facebook notifications for appointment availability. Mumford reported that Resident Assistants would be vaccinated on April 7. Capriolo encouraged the commission to volunteer for the Butler County vaccination site. Douglas encouraged people who want to get a vaccine to visit the Ohio Get the Shot website<sup>2</sup> or use the ArmorVax app<sup>3</sup>.

Capriolo lamented the loss of Spring Break and encouraged commission members to take care of themselves and give themselves breaks.
